Middle Bridge

The first bridge here used old SEC poles upon which the deck and rails were constructed. This view is looking eastwards. Note the paddock fencing.



Old bridge pulled out, February 2022. Same view eastwards. Temporary embankments were created to contain the water coming into the reservoir prior to the concrete base being laid in March.







April 2022. It's now looking like a bridge. Work still to be done on its southern side, paths to be re-formed, water channel to be re-established and general landscaping to be undertaken.

- Continued work carried out to monitor trees and remove fallen limbs from public areas.

- Latrobe Bobcat recently carried out pond clearing on the Rose Avenue ponds.
- Loy Yang B has been a valued long-time supporter and the latest project funded under their sponsorship was to fence the block adjacent to the Reserve at the end of Hickox Street. The land here is an extension to the Reserve protecting and extending the ecological values of this area.


